- Making the 3D CAD file:
  - ➤ Private (or other) copying exemption?

- Offering and disseminating the 3D CAD file:
  - O Infringement of right to make available to the public:
    - ➤ Sharing in P2P networks (+)
    - Sharing within family or with close friends (-)



# Copyright

#### Copyright

- Making of the 3D replica "3D printing":
  - ➤ Private (or other) copying exemption?

- Offering and disseminating of the 3D replica:
  - ➤ Infringement of <u>distribution right</u>, if to the public
    - Offering on eBay (+)
    - Present to close friend (-)(?)

  - **≻**Registration
  - ➤ Unregistered designs?

#### **Trademarks**

#### Trademarks

- Trademark protection
  - ➤ Registration of 3D trademarks advisable (if possible)
  - > Also other trademarks may grant some protection
    - ➤ E.g. wordmark "GUCCI"?





#### **Trademarks**

#### Trademarks

- Infringement by
  - ➤ Offering and disseminating the 3D CAD file

- <u>Problem</u>: use as a trademark by 3D CAD file (CAD file)?
  - No editorial use privilege for internet offer of CAD file
  - European and German law: infringement, even if claim that unauthorized



#### **Trademarks**

- Trademarks
  - Infringement by
    - **➢**Offering and disseminating the 3D CAD file

- <u>Problem</u>: infringement
  - ➤ Risk of confusion: Sufficient similarity of handbags with 3D CAD file?
  - ➤ Gucci etc. can also rely on protection of well-known marks





#### In the Course of Trade?

- Designs, trademarks (and unfair competition)
  - Protection limited to uses "in the course of trade"
  - Private use will not infringe
  - Examples:





#### In the Course of Trade?

- Designs, trademarks (and unfair competition)
  - Private use will not infringe
  - Examples:
    - ➤ Private sharing on P2P networks will not infringe



#### In the Course of Trade?


- Designs, trademarks (and unfair competition)
  - Private use will not infringe
  - Examples:
    - ➤ Selling on eBay (German case law)?
      - Private use possible, even if offered to the public
      - Use "in the course of trade" if repeatedly offering the same and new products (history of the user's activities)



# Design rights: Spare Parts Exception?

• Can 3D printing of **spare parts** profit from repair privilege

("must match")?



- Europe: no harmonization
  - EU design: no design protection for spare parts
  - Same situation i.a. in Belgium, Spain, United Kingdom
  - German design: design protection for spare parts
  - Same situation i.a. in Austria, Denmark, France, Poland, Sweden

# Consequences for IP strategy

- In copyright, chain of title needs to be documented (as usually no registration)
- Designs and 3D trademarks should be registered, where possible
- Trademark protection extended to
   international class 9 (downloadable electronic files)?

- What IP rights grants best protection against illegal 3D printing?
- What are the gaps in IP protection against illegal 3D printing?



#### Best protection and gaps

- Copyright grants best protection (if available)
- Designs, Trademarks (and unfair competition) also work, but only if infringement "in the course of trade". i.e. not for private sharing in P2P networks, not for private offers on eBay
- Should IP law allow this distinction between commercial and private 3D printing? Or is there a need to legislate?



#### Best protection and gaps

- And last but not least: Learn from the music and film industry
- Difficult fight against online infringements if no legal alternative
- Put a legal offer of 3D files on the market (if the business model permits it)
